Team Fees:

The 2009 team fee is \$950.00. This fee is for a maximum of 16 players.

(15 skaters and a goalie)

Payment Schedule:

- All teams need to be fully paid at least 2 weeks (August 14, 2009) from the start of a tournament. A Deposit of \$250, reserves the slot. If a team is not fully paid by August 14, 2009 the slot in the tournament occupied by that team will be up for grabs and ALL money paid to that point will be forfeited. Any check that bounces will result in a disqualification from the tournament and the team will be placed on the suspension list until all money is paid (the tournament fee, return check fee, and a \$25 penalty fee). NO REFUNDS GRANTED from the time the schedule is released on.
- If you sign up by August 1, 2009 a non-refundable deposit \$250.00 holds your teams slot
- Any date after August 1, 2009 the full team fee is due at sign up.
- FINAL PAYMENTS DUE BY August 14, 2009. No exceptions!



2009 Tournament Rules & Player Eligibility

Rosters & Player Registration:

- No player can be less than 18 years old.
- All rosters must be finalized prior to August 14, 2009.
- All players must be registered with USA Hockey
- All players USA Hockey registrations card or the bar code print out from USA hockey site, must be submitted along with the team roster and received by August 14, 2009. Any additions made after August 14, 2009 are subject to being charged a player fee of \$90. If an injury occurs or a replacement needs to be made after August 14, 2009 the captain must designate who will not play and replace that person with the new person. No additional charge will be applied. The new player, however, must have USA Hockey registrations card or the bar code print out from USA hockey site

Thank you in advance for your cooperation in knowing and following the rules below...

Schedules:

The final team schedules will be sent to the team captains between August 15th, 2009 and August 21st, 2009. No team will get a schedule with a balance due. All schedules are FINAL.

Rules:

1. No Checking - No fighting

Any player who intentionally checks another player will be assessed a minor penalty. Any player intentionally attempting to injure or who fights will be expelled from the tournament, forfeiting all monies and expulsion from the building for the remainder of the tournament and may be permanently banned from all future Bremerton Ice Center events.

2. Team Registration

All teams need to be fully paid at least 2 weeks (August 14, 2009) from the start of a tournament. A Deposit of \$250, reserves the slot. If a team is not fully paid by August 14, 2009, the slot in the tournament occupied by that team will be up for grabs and ALL money paid to that point will be forfeited. Any check that bounces will result in a disqualification from the tournament and the team will be placed on the suspension list until all money is paid (the tournament fee, return check fee, and a \$25 penalty fee). NO REFUNDS GRANTED from the time the schedule is released on.

3. Team Rosters

All captains must complete a roster by August 14, 2009 prior to the start of the tournament. Each player needs to have a number assigned to them and no team can have duplicate numbers. Also, on the roster, a team captain needs to assign 2 players as alternate captains. In the event a captain is not at a game, one of the alternates will assume the captain duties.

Once the tournament starts, and if it is determined that a player is playing but not on the roster, then the entire team that the player is currently playing with will forfeit the remaining games. No refund will be provided.

4. Player Qualifications:

- A player cannot play on two teams within the same division and cannot be on the same roster of two teams in the same division. The burden is on the player not the tournament officials to follow this. If an opponent wishes to challenge this, then the tournament officials will check both rosters

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of the teams in question. If there is a duplicate player, the player in violation of this rule will be asked to leave the tournament.

- No player can be less than 18 years old.
- All players must have a USA Hockey registrations card or the bar code print out from USA hockey site, and it must be submitted along with the team roster and received by August 14, 2009.

5. Player Conduct

A. Any player deemed intoxicated during the game by the tournament organizers or on ice officials will be removed from the game and not allowed back into the tournament.

B. Any player displaying any unnecessary roughness will be warned once, if the warning is ignored the player will be expelled from the tournament.

C. Conduct in the locker room before and after the game and any where in the facility will be monitored.

D. After your game, your equipment must be removed no more than 1/2 hour following your game. This will allow us to prepare the locker room for the follow team's arrival.

E. Players must stay off the ice during resurfacing; violations will be a minor penalty delay of game assessed to the violation team.

F. At no time will verbal or physical abuse will be tolerated during the tournament, on the premises or in the parking areas. Verbal or physical abuse will result in expulsion from the tournament and any physical abuse will be prosecuted in a court of law in the state of Washington. At no time will a player abuse an official, including score keepers, exhibitors, fans or personnel from the rink.

6. Game Rules

- A. All games are NO check, full slap shot
- B. All players must wear helmets at all times including warm ups
- C. All players must be over the minimum age of 18.
- D. All players must play in at least 2 games to be eligible for Sundays playoffs
- E. the tag up rule for delayed off sides is also enforced.

7. Game format

Three (12) minute stop time periods, no overtime periods in preliminary rounds, warm up time is (3) minutes. The slaughter rule is in effect, the time will go to running time if the goal differential is 8 goals or more, The clock will return to stop time when less than (8) goals.

8. Game Times

Game times are subject to change, all teams must be in attendance 30 minutes prior to the start of their game, if a team is not on the ice by the end of the 3 minute warm up, a minor penalty will be assessed to the offending team. If a team is 10 minutes late for the start of a game it will be considered a forfeit.

9. Forfeits

Teams must show up for every game. It is not fair to the opposing team, time keepers and officials. Teams that forfeit a game will be placed on the suspension list. Also, with the tiebreakers leaning heavily towards goals against, a forfeit will not be a 1-0 loss but the score based on the number of players on the other team that dress. If there are 15 players who dress, it is a 15-0 game. Also, the team will not be eligible for any playoffs for the tournament when the forfeit occurred.

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PLAYOFF FORMAT

The playoff tie-breakers will be ordered as follows:

1. Total Points
2. Total Wins
3. Least Goals Against
4. Least penalty minutes
5. Head to head
6. Better win-loss versus common opponents
7. Better goals against versus common opponents
8. Most goals for versus common opponents
9. Most goals for
10. Coin Flip

PLAYOFF GAMES

If a playoff game is tied after 3 periods, a 5 minute 5 on 5 sudden death overtime will take place. If after the 5 minute overtime the score is still tied, a shootout will take place. Each team will designate 5 skaters to shoot. The team which tied the game in regulation will go first. In event of a 0-0 game, the team on the visiting bench will go first. Each team alternates skaters. The goalie cannot make a move until the puck is touched by the shooter. After the 3 skaters from both teams have gone, the team with the most goals in the shootout wins the game. If the score at the end of the shootout is still tied, each team selects a shooter (one who hasn't taken a shot yet). The team that went first in the first shootout goes first again.

After both teams have shot once, the team with the most goals in that round wins the game. If still tied, repeat this until a winner. Once all skaters have taken a shot on a team, then the order goes back to the skater who shot first in the shootout for that team. A player cannot shoot twice in a shootout until all skaters on the team has taken at a shot. This process continues until there is a winner.

PENALTIES

Minor	1 1/2 minutes
Major	5 minutes
Fight aggressor	3 minutes plus expulsion from the tournament
Misconduct	6 minutes
4 penalties	If any player receives 4 penalties he will be removed from the game.
